In my past articles I have mentioned my high school days in the Rod Hawks car club and drag racing on the county road just outside my home town. One of my frequent rivals was Marvin, he was also a member of the Rod Hawks and a farm

kid like me. Marvin had a red 1957 Plymouth that he thought was pretty fast. It was actually fairly fast for a mostly stock engine. Marvin's problem was that he did not understand how to race his car against a car like mine. I had built the small block Chevy engine in my 1957 Chevy to be run up to high RPMs. It was a dynamically balanced 327 cubic inch with a dual coil ignition and dual valve springs so it would rev to over 7000 RPMs without floating the valves or the ignition points. So that was my advantage to really wind it up before shifting to the next gear. Marvin seemed to think he had to wait for me to shift before he would shift his car. By the time that happened, he was falling behind. After losing several races he decided that his best bet to be more competitive was a new Ford. The 390 cubic inch Ford was not really much of an improvement for Marvin because it was not capable of turning the high RPMs either. Those drag racing experiences helped me form my admiration for the capabilities of the small block Chevy engines that have been so successful for all of these years. They certainly have benefited from a lot of new technology as they evolved, but there are still a lot of similarities with the original design. I have just read about the 755 HP 2019 Corvette ZR1 that makes all that power with an engine that was first introduced as a 265 ci. V8 way back in 1955.

NICC HELPS LOCAL CHARITIES

HAPPY New Year!

We are blessed. On December 19, Leon, Dennis and I had the opportunity to visit several charities in the Rockford area and present them with our annual donation.

We were able to meet the staff at RAMP and have a photo opportunity. RAMP provides employment and community services for adults with disabilities. They are located on Market Street behind the City Market. The NICC donation was \$500.

We moved on to The Carpenter's Place where we met the staff, took photos and was given a great tour of the facilities. The mission of The Carpenter's Place is to provide the tools necessary for rebuilding the lives of homeless adults. What great work they do! They are located on Railroad Avenue. The donation amounted \$500.

We also got to meet staff, volunteers, photo op, and tour of the Rock River Food Pantry. They provide three day supply of food for an individuals and families. They are set-up like a store, which is a very interesting concept. Participants can pick out healthy choices but also what they like to eat. The food pantry is located on South Rockton. Our donation was \$200.

We stopped at Rockford MELD which operates with Youth Services. We presented a check at Trinity House Shelter on Kishwaukee Street. MELD at Trinity House provides housing for homeless pregnant or parenting young mothers and their children. Our donation was \$500.

The American Cancer Society has moved their Rockford office. Services are provided by the Peoria office. I contacted the OSF (St. Anthony). The cancer society provides wigs to their cancer center. Mailed check to Oakbrook Terrance office, North Central Region, earmarked for Northern Illinois. The donation was \$500.

Next we toured Rosecrance, where we presented a check for over \$2,500, funds from "\$ for the Troops" car shows. The veteran's unit is set up with living area, double rooms and kitchen. Very impressed by the whole facility, which is located on Harrison Avenue.

GiGi's Playhouse provides social and educational programs for individuals with Down syndrome. We had a tour of the facility and photos. The facility is located on North Second in Loves Park. The donation amounted \$400.

Donation checks were mailed to Belvidere and Freeport Food Pantry for \$200 each.

NICC should be very proud of the charities we support. A big thank you goes to Leon for driving and Dennis for being our photographer. The pictures can be viewed on the website.

11 of the Greatest Corvettes of All Time

There have been a lot of great Corvettes since the model debuted in 1953. These are the best.

1957 Fuel Injected

The original Corvette of 1953 was a pretty car, but it took a few years of evolution for it to become great. In 1955, it got its first V8, Chevy's legendary small block, and in 1957 that engine got fuel injection. Designed by legendary engineer Zora-Arkus Duntov, the "Fuelie" was the first time the Corvette featured revolutionary tech.

1963 Sting Ray "Split-Window"

The second-generation Corvette, introduced in 1963, was really when this model hit its stride. It represented the work of the best minds of GM at the time—designers Bill Mitchell, Pete Brock, and Larry Shinoda, and engineer Zora-Arkus Duntov. There are lots of great C2s, but the one-year-only split-window coupe from 1963 is the prettiest, and arguably, the most iconic.

1963 Grand Sport

Zora-Arkus Duntov wanted to take the C2 Corvette racing, and to do so, he created a monster. The [original Grand Sport](#), which was internally called "The Lightweight," looks like a production car at first glance, but it's actually smaller. An aluminum tubular space frame with fiberglass body panels kept weight under a ton, and a 377-ci V8 provided well over 500 horsepower. Sadly, GM's competition ban killed the Grand Sport after just five were built.

1967-1969 L88

Chevrolet's competition ban continued well into the 1960s, but just as he did with the Grand Sport, Duntov attempted to fight it back. In 1967, he introduced [the L88](#), a race-ready Corvette you could order at your local dealer. It was advertised as having just 435 hp, but in reality, its 427-ci Big Block produced around 550. Only 216 were built, since only those in the know knew to check the L88 box.

1990-1995 ZR-1

When Chevrolet introduced the Corvette ZR-1 for 1990, it came as a bit of a shock. Seemingly out of nowhere, Chevrolet had created a Corvette that could genuinely compete against the Ferrari Testarossa and Porsche 911 Turbo. Its engine, the LT5, was especially brilliant. Designed by Lotus, this was the first and only twin-cam Corvette engine in history and it made an amazing 380 hp.

1999-2004 C5-R

I already [waxed poetic about the C5-R yesterday](#), but in case you don't want to click away from this page, here's a quick summary. This was Chevy's first official competition Corvette, and it quickly became an icon. With tons of success in US sports car racing and at Le Mans, the C5-R was the car that got a lot of people to take the Corvette more seriously.

2000-2004 Z06

The C5 Corvette was a quantum leap forward when it arrived in 1997. With an aluminum chassis, rear transaxle, and a new family of V8s, it was truly world-class. The best of the C5s was the Z06, which was really the first modern Corvette for track rats. Even today, a C5 Z06 on modern rubber and with a good driver can keep up with anything. Buy one [before its too late](#).

2006-2013 Z06

The C6 Z06 upped the ante of its predecessor by introducing one of Chevy's great V8s, the LS7. This 7.0-liter naturally aspirated motor cranked out 505 hp and was closely related to the unit used in the C6.R race car. You could buy this car for its engine alone, but it handles great too.

2009-2013 ZR1

We have to admit that the C6 Z06 is more our style, but how can you not love the ZR1? This was the first supercharged Corvette, and the first to break the 200-mph barrier.

2015-Present Stingray

Yes, the Z06 is much quicker, and we're big fans of the Grand Sport, but the C7 Stingray will be remembered as a watershed moment. Philosophically, it's not all that different than the C5 and C6, but it represents a huge improvement in every metric. It's a Corvette that can hold its head high against Europe's best.

2015-Present C7.R

The C7.R continues the tradition of dominance established by the C5-R back in 1999. In its three years of competition, the C7.R already has victories at Daytona, Sebring, and Le Mans to its credit. And, it's the best sounding car on the grid by far.
